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A Very Corona Christmas Activities for Grades K-2

Basic Discussion:

Read the story *A Very Corona Christmas*. Then ask the children some of the following questions. You may use the illustrations attached as examples.*







1. Why were the elves so surprised?

2. How would you feel if you were one of the elves after Santa gave his speech?

3. How did you feel when you first went into lockdown and were not allowed to go to school anymore?

4. The elves in the story are told to stop working. Did your parents continue to work during lockdown? How have things been different at home since the pandemic began?

6. Imagine you are an elf. What do you think you would do all day when you are not making toys? What do you think Santa would do?

- 7. Did you write to Santa? What did you say?
- 8. If you could talk to Santa what would you tell him about your year?

9. Do you miss the way things were before the pandemic? What do you miss? Is there anything better now than before?

10. Are you looking forward to Christmas? Why or why not?

Writing Activity:

Write a letter to Santa telling him a little bit about your year. Are you looking forward to Christmas? What do you want more than anything this year?

Drawing Activity:

At the end of the story Santa's elves create for him a new Santa suit and update his sleigh. Imagine you are the illustrator. How would you draw a picture of Santa's new suit? What would his sleigh look like? What gadgets and improvements would you add to Santa's sleigh?

Santa's suit is missing. Can you draw him a new one?

Discussion:

In the story *A Very Corona Christmas* the author describes the way the North Pole might look during the 2020 pandemic.

- 1. Do you agree with the author?
- 2. How do you think things might look differently?
- 3. What would you have added to the story?
- 4. Do you think that Santa would be allowed to enter your country?
- 5. How have things changed for you since this pandemic began?
- 5. How do you think Christmas will be different this year?

Writing Activity Grade 3-6:

Imagine you are an elf at the North Pole during lockdown. Write a newspaper article for the Reindeer Times explaining how crazy things have gotten at the North Pole. You may use story details to add to your text, for example world leaders have written to Santa to cancel Christmas. You will need to choose the time period carefully. You can write your article either during the North Pole lockdown or after Santa has made a decision to indeed deliver gifts.

Drawing Activity:

At the end of the story Santa's elves create for him a new Santa suit and update his sleigh. Imagine you are an elf designer at the North Pole. How would your Santa suit look? How would you make a Covid 19-ready sleigh? Choose either Santa's suit or sleigh and draw your design explaining each of the elements and why your design is the best.
